

A bit of history. On this day in 1985, the European Space Agency launched the Giotto space probe to get a closer look at Halley's Comet. About nine month later it became the first space probe to observe a comet close up. It came within 360 miles of his surface.





Space Junk Solution?

A tiny satellite has reached orbit last week that will make history when it comes back to Earth later this summer.

The D-Sat Cubesat, which was launched by milan-based start up D-Orbit, soared into space atop India's PSLV rocket. D-Sat is fitted with an independent thruster system known as D-Orbit Decommissioning Device. It is designed to help mitigate the growing space junk problem.

When D-Sat's mission comes to an end in August, the device will guide the satellite to a controlled destruction in Earth's atmosphere. It is an intelligent motor that you install on satellites before launch and it enables the satellite to be removed at the end of life in a very quick and controlled way.
